

Initial concert: Odonata...

- Symphonic work (10'00")
 - Inspired by dragonflies and damselflies
- Raise awareness towards their declining numbers and habitat loss in the UK
 - Celebrate the species and charities fighting for their protection
- Performed alongside other environmental works...
 - Focus on wildlife or relating environmental issues





The Concert:

While Odonata bears personal significance in this project, it is paramount to recognise its position within a broader tradition of composers drawing inspiration from the environment and/or subsequently dedicated their works to it and its preservation. Having curated the plan for this project, I have encompassed a diverse list of potential repensive to accompany Odonata fit for such an opportunity.
