

The Passing of the Year

Whitehall Choir is thrilled to present the world première of Russell Hepplewhite's *Riddle*, a setting of a wonderful new poem by Aice Oswald. This is part of Hepplewhite's national 'Living Voices' project: Whitehall Choir has the honour of being selected to represent London. Each choir involved with the project will perform his settings of newly commissioned texts including by Pam Ayres, Andrew Motion and Michael Rosen.

The concert celebrates the exciting soundscape of contemporary choral music and features music related to the passing of time. Jonathan Dove's much-loved *The Passing of the Year* was written in 2000, in memory of the composer's mother and is a collection of seven songs, including poems by Blake and Tennyson. The composer's use of double choir gives a thrilling variety of colours and drama.

Whitehall Choir, under its dynamic Music Director Joanna Tomlinson, is one of London's leading amateur choirs.

Joanna Tomlinson is also Artistic Director of Constanza Chorus. Recent engagements include conducting the National Youth Choir at the Royal Albert Hall, Bach's Mass in B minor at Cadogan Hall with Constanza Chorus and the Orchestra of the Age of Enlightenment and adjudicating for the Vox Lucensis International Choral Competition in Lucca.

Ian Tindale, accompanist of Whitehall Choir, was awarded the Pianist's Prize at the Wigmore Hall/Kohn Foundation Song Competition in 2017. Recent engagements include song recitals on BBC Radio 3, at the Edinburgh International Festival and the Ludlow English Song Festival. He also regularly appears with the BBC Symphony and London Symphony Orchestras.
